Townsville's Iconic Experiences

The Strand

Townsville's famous foreshore, The Strand, is the perfect place to hang out during your visit. Stretching 2.5km and offering views to Magnetic Island, The Strand is a favourite for locals and visitors BBQ facilities, swimming enclosures, freshwater showers, a waterpark and waterfront dining make this an obvious place to visit.



Castle Hill

Become the king or queen of the castle when you stand at the top of Townsville's iconic pink granite monolith, Castle Hill. The lookout points serve as the perfect place to orientate yourself with the city. Take the easy drive to the top for stunning panoramic views of Magnetic Island and Townsville, or challenge yourself and join the 2,500 locals that run and walk up the Hill every day – if you're up for it.

Queens Gardens

A short walk from the CBD and The Strand, Queens Gardens are the oldest Botanic Gardens in Townsville. Covering four hectares, the Gardens are a lush green oasis set against Castle Hill, offering a quiet, cool retreat from the nearby city centre. Other 'must see' gardens in Townsville include Anderson Gardens and the Palmetum.

Riverway

Two huge swimming lagoons, parklands, a performance and arts centre and a sports stadium, all situated on the banks of the Ross River. The Riverway precinct is the perfect place to cool off and enjoy the great outdoor lifestyle that North Queensland is famous for.

Jezzine Barracks

Jezzine Barracks was home to Australian Military Units for over 120 years and has now been redeveloped into a beautiful public space that includes public art, gardens, lookouts and a boardwalk that connects the popular Strand to Pallarenda beach front.

The Townsville CBD is growing its reputation as a centre for fashion, food and entertainment. You can enjoy boutique shopping, alfresco dining and regular local markets, held every Sunday morning on Flinders Street. 

BILLABONG SANCTUARY





Discover Magnetic Island

Just a short ferry ride from Townsville, Magnetic Island is a tropical paradise that slows down time. If you're looking for a place to put your feet up and chill, bask in the sun and enjoy the great outdoors then Magnetic Island is ideal. Do not despair though, the Island still provides the opportunity for a big night out if you're up for it!

Magnetic Island is two-thirds protected national park and is home to some amazing adventures that are guaranteed to make you wish you could stay longer. The Island has 25km of walking tracks, guiding visitors from bay to bay through bushlands of dry wattles and eucalyptus to pockets of rainforest or via the many coastal walks around the Island. The Island's National Park is also home to Northern Australia's largest colony of wild koalas and many rock wallabies. Bush walks allow native animals to be viewed up close in their natural habitats – you can even hand feed the wild rock wallabies.







Getting There and Around

Magnetic Island is only 20 minutes on the SeaLink Queensland ferry from Townsville, with 18 return services a day and secure car parking available right next to the terminal. If you want to bring your own vehicle the Fantasea Cruising Magnetic Barge offers eight return services every day. Once on the Island, the public bus service makes tripping around a breeze. Alternatively, you can hire a scooter, colourful topless car or baby four wheel drive.





Magnetic Island 'Must-Dos'

In and On the Water

Explore Magnetic Island from the water. Various boats offer day trips and snortelling as well as sunset sails, reef trips, diving charters, sea kayaking, sailing and fishing charters and other water activities.

23 beaches and bays leave swimmers spoilt for choice on Magnetic Island. The most popular beaches for taking a dip are Horseshoe, Alma and Picnic Bays. Be mindful of stingers in the summer months from November to May – stinger suits are available for hire across the Island. Safe swimming enclosures are located at Horseshoe and Picnic Bays.



Hand Feed Rock Wallabies

Get up close and personal with the Island's resident population of rock wallabies. Purchase wallaby food at the Arcadia Newsagency and take the short walk to the old car ferry terminal at Geoffrey Bay. The best time of day to see the wallabies is late afternoon. Please do not feed them human food. Careful, they are really cute.

Snorkel Fringing Reef

Florence, Radical and Arthur Bays allow snorkelers an opportunity to walk off the beach and discover the fringing reefs. Visitors can also explore the snorkel trails at Nelly and Geoffrey Bays — look out for the WWII aeroplane propeller in Geoffrey Bay and the giant clams along the way.

The Famous Forts Walk

The Forts Walk is the best place on Magnetic Island to see a koala in the wild. Go early in the morning or late in the afternoon to increase your chances of spotting these cuddly creatures. Make sure you take your camera, the 360 degree views at the top and the WWII fortifications along the way make for some great photographs.

Koala Tip!

Koalas sleep during the day, so you're going to need a keen eye to spot one of these cuddly creatures! Some tell-tale signs include koala droppings, trees stripped of leaves and a grey furry thing asleep in the fork of the tree. If you do see one, draw an arrow on the track so other walkers don't miss out on seeing it as well.

Toad Races

If you would rather spectate than participate, head to the toad races held every Wednesday night at Hotel Arcadia. Lay your bets as Magnetic Island's finest toads try to make it across the line first.

Horse Riding on the Beach

Have yourself a horseback adventure in Horseshoe Bay. Take your horse for a swim in the cool, clear waters of the Bay and enjoy the scenic beauty and wildlife along the way.



Party 'til Sun Up

Those looking to party should head to the monthly Full Moon Down Under Party held at Base Magnetic Island. Join locals and internationals, in crowds of up to 2,500, dancing on the beach until dawn to the sounds of internationally renowned DJs. If you miss the full Moon Party, both Base and Bungalow Bay have bars open til late.

Go Topless!

A visit to Magnetic Island isn't complete without hiring a topless car. These iconic vehicles are a great way to see the Island, and a whole lot of fun to drive.

Speaking of topless, the Island is also home to a couple of nudist beaches – you can find those for yourself.

Your Magnetic Island Itinerary

Day

Explore the Island's most popular spots with a hire car or scooter, by bus or on foot! Visit the popular Nelly, Picnic, Alma and Horseshoe Bays. Buy some wallaby food from the Arcadia Newsagency and feed the friendly rock wallabies at the old car ferry terminal at Geoffrey Bay. No, you cannot take one home!

Day 2

Get friendly with the locals! Head up the popular Forts Walk for your chance to spot a koala — early morning or late afternoon is best. Purchase a swim card from a local retailer and get wet on the Snorkel Trails at Geoffrey and Nelly Bays.

You will have the chance to discover giant clams, live coral and even a WWII plane propeller.

Day

Uncover hidden beaches, bays and even shipwrecks when you jump aboard a charter. Exploring Magnetic Island by water is a great way to see the Island's beauty. Head to Hotel Arcadia at 8:00pm every Wednesday night for Magnetic Island's famous toad races, or Bungalow Bay Koala Village for Coconut Bowling on a Thursday night.

Discover the Great Barrier Reef

Accessible from Townsville, the central section of the Great Barrier Reef offers some of the best diving sites on the east coast, from shallow lagoons, pinnacles rising from 30m to 5m from the surface, walls, swim throughs and famous wrecks.

Day Trips

Departing from Townsville, day trips are offered by a variety of operators and often visit Lodestone Reef, home to a variety of habitats and a great diversity of fish life, including small damsels and butterfly fish to larger animals like the giant trevally and occasional reef shark. Don't worry, they don't bite.

Multi Day Trips

Multi day trips visit locations like Wheeler Reef, with its white sandy cay and many pelagic species, Davies Reef with pinnacles rising from 30 metres and shallower bommies riddled with swim throughs and caves, and Barra Bommie at Little Broadhurst Reef, where you can spot an octopus. Most of the travelling is done at night to maximise your time in the water.



SS Yongala Wreck Dive

Experienced divers should visit the SS Yongala, a 28m deep shipwreck that sank off the coast of Ayr (just south of Townsville in the Burdekin) during a tropical cyclone in 1911. Rated one of the world's top 10 dive wrecks, the SS Yongala is home to a captivating array of hard and soft coral and spectacular marine life including sea turtles, sea anemone and thousands of inquisitive reef fish you can take selfies with. Dive trips to the SS Yongala depart from Townsville, Magnetic Island and Alva Beach in the Burdekin. This historic wreck will leave you with memories that last a lifetime.

Head North - Discover Rainforest & Waterfalls

Queensland is home to spectacular World Heritage listed Wet Tropics Rainforest and National Parks. Just an hour north of Townsville is the Hinchinbrook Shire, a wonderland of nature based attractions just waiting for you to come and explore.

Crystal Creek

For a pleasant change of climate and scenery, travel 45 minutes north of Townsville and turn left to Crystal Creek and Paluma.

Big Crystal Creek, at the base of the Paluma Range, features a large swimming hole, natural rock slides and a picnicking area.

Little Crystal Creek, located Ilkm up the winding road to Paluma Village, is well known for its historic stone arch bridge, built in the 1930s. Cascading waterfalls feed into one of the best freshwater swimming holes in the north.

Paluma

Continue up to Paluma Village nestled amongst the misty clouds. Located within the Mount Spec National Park, it is the southernmost point in the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area. At 1,000m above sea level, Paluma is a cool mountain retreat that offers cosy accommodation, camping, cafés, arts and craft, bird watching and a large network of rainforest walks.

TYTO

Be inspired at the award winning, multidimensional TYTO. TYTO is a unique 120 hectare natural wetland area that is home to over 230 species of birds, tropical plants and native wildlife. Extensive walking tracks allow visitors to explore the park at their own pace. Enjoy the lagoons as you walk along the boardwalk linking the TYTO Information and Wetlands Centre and TYTO Regional Gallery. The precinc offers waterfront dining, a historical cane display and a birds-eye view of the area by climbing the Ilm observation tower.

Wallaman Falls

Those looking for a day's adventure should visit Australia's tallest sheer drop waterfall, Wallaman Falls. Girringun National Park is the gateway to the Wet Tropics Great Walks and home to the shy platypus and endangered southern cassowary. A little further north is Broadwater State Forest, which offers tropical rainforest and open eucalypt forest.

Hinchinbrook Kland

Hinchinbrook Island is North Queensland's largest National Park Island with the neighbouring channel home to an impressive collection of marine life including dugong and green sea turtles. The world famous Thorsborne Trail is 32km of mountainous tropical terrain stretching along the eastern side of the Island, perfect for the traveller with a thirst for adventure.





Rainforest & Waterfalls

Your Rainforest & Waterfalls Itinerary

Day 1

Refresh yourself in the cool, clear waters of Little or Big Crystal Creeks. Travel up Mt Spec Road and enjoy a picnic lunch in Paluma Village at McClelland's Lookout. Don't forget to try North Queensland's best ice cream at Frosty Mango.

Day 2

Visit Australia's highest sheer drop waterfall - Wallaman Falls, Hike to the base of the Falls and take in this spectacular sight from a whole new perspective. Make sure to take a hat and sunscreen and wear walking shoes - it's quite a tough walk!

Day 3 Visit the TYTO Information and about Hinchinbrook. Work up a thirst exploring the wetlands and then visit Ingham for its authentic Italian delis and the original Pub with no Beer - made famous by Slim Dusty. Don't worry, there's beer available.

Ravenswood

You'll feel like you've stepped back in time when you spend a day exploring Ravenswood, west of Townsville. Formerly a gold mining town, today the main street looks like a movie set with its beautiful old buildings, mullock heaps and chimney stacks. You probably won't see Brad and Angelina here, but you will see the Court House Museum, the restored School House, Thorp's Building and Butler's Cottage - just some of the treasures of this tiny town.

Take a self-guided walk to visit them all or climb to the top of the local lookout to view the amazing open-cut mine. The photo will be sure to get some likes on Facebook.

Charters Towers

Your journey into the past continues as you drive through the streets of Charters Towers — a living montage of Australian history and heritage. Gold was first discovered in Charters Towers in 1871 by Aboriginal horse boy, Jupiter Mosman — who knows, maybe you'll get lucky too.

Once gold was discovered thousands from across the globe flocked in a mad rush to the town, once the second largest in Queensland. The town was believed to have everything a civilised person could want and soon became known as "The World".

The magnificent heritage buildings are testament to the prosperity of the era. The heritage listed Stock Exchange Arcade, the World Theatre, City Hall and the Post Office Tower will have you reaching for your camera. Don't forget to visit the iconic drive-in cinema for flicks under the stars, the Towers Hill lookout and the largest surviving Battery relic in Australia, the Venus Gold Battery. Worked up a thirst? You definitely won't get dehydrated in this town, there's a pub on nearly every corner.







Your Charters Towers & Ravenswood Itinerary


Day 1

Explore historic Charters Towers. Pick up the self-drive audio tour CD and map from the Visitor Information Centre and find yourself in the past. Uncover heritage listed buildings like the Stock Exchange Arcade, the World Theatre and the Post Office Tower. Once you've worked up a thirst, grab a cool refreshment at one of the local pubs.

Day 2

Stay the night in a haunted hotel room in Ravenswood – if you dare. Explore the mullock heaps and abandoned mining equipment and visit the lookout at the open-cut gold mine.

Agricultural Adventures

Just one hour's drive south of Townsville is the Burdekin Shire – the sugar capital of Australia, fishing mecca and bird watching paradise.

The district is made up of the neighbouring towns of Ayr and Home Hill and includes over a dozen other smaller centres. It is as famous for its rich, flat farmlands as it is for its amazing waterways and scenibeauty. The Burdekin maintains a healthy reputation for its friendly residents, great specialty stores and laid back lifestyle.

North Queensland Icon

The Burdekin River Bridge, which links Ayr and Home Hill, is the district's best known landmark. Known as the Silver Link, the 1,103m crossing is the only bridge in Australia built without a solid footing and is longer than the Sydney Harbour Bridge – take that, Sydney!

Wet a Line

Fantastic fishing is on offer in the estuaries and waterways of the fertile Burdekin Delta. Fishing tours are available to catch barramundi, mud crabs, prawns, mangrove jack and morel

Work in the Burdekin

The Burdekin offers an abundance of fruit and vegetable picking work for travellers.

May to November – capsicum, egg fruit, cherry tomatoes, chillies, zucchini September to December – melons November to December – mangoes
